The Innovation District is a setting where new ideas and partnerships come to life as our faculty and students collaborate with industry, government and community leaders. It will include:

- 1.6 million square feet of research and innovation space developed primarily through public and private partnerships
- An incubator and accelerator that will help transform research discoveries into products that benefit the public
- Hubs that leverage trans-disciplinary collaborations and design creative solutions to complex problems. Hubs will emphasize community engagement, workforce development, experiential learning and cross border and global impacts.

SDSU Mission Valley

The Innovation District will be part of a vibrant, mixed-use development that includes parks and bike paths, housing, a hotel and conference center, SDSU's Snapdragon Stadium, and easy access to public transportation. The trolley station at SDSU Mission Valley is only three stops from the SDSU campus, and provides connections throughout San Diego. Construction on the stadium is underway and the first Innovation District hub will likely be completed in 2024-2025, with a full build-out over the course of the next decade.
